

Health and Nutrition

Improve in Health & Nutrition Outcome in two months (from up to Nov 2017 to upto Jan 2018)

Health -

1 New Born (Child Health) -

- Full Immunization among 12-23 months Children has improved by 2% (from 70% to 72%). (Source HMIS).
- House to House survey conducted to identify missed child and update due list.
- Special camps are being conducted to increase immunization status (to minimize dropout & left out).
- Weak newborn identification has improved by 2% (from 10% to 12%).

2 Maternal Health-

- A flow chart is developed from conceiving of a woman till a child's full immunization inclusive of all services.
- To improve quality services in VHSND sites Arogya Diwas is rolled out at district & block level across the district and thereby sessions initiated accordingly.
- Focus is given in increasing early registration of pregnant women & ensuring 4 ANC's.
- Baseline survey is being conducted (House to House) to identify missed pregnant women and to identify Eligible couple for ANC's and FP Services.
- Full ANC Improved by 24% within 2 months (from Nov 2017 to Jan 2018).
- Institutional Birth has improved by 3% (from 72% to 75%) in two months (from Nov 2017 to Jan 2018).
- New L1 Facilities have been identified to cater more population for institutional delivery. L1 Points increased from 24 to 28 within 2 months in the district.

3 Immediate actions taken by the district-

- a. Rigorous and regular review meeting on fortnight basis are being done under Chairmanship of the District Magistrate with all departments.
- b. Review of Frontline Workers at Sub-divisional level by District Magistrate and District Health officials (including the staff at block and outreach workers), which is targeted for increasing early registration of pregnant women and 4 ANC's (Anti-natal Check-up and Care), promoting basket of choices in Family Planning and improve in service delivery mechanism.
- c. Process of HR rationalization of available resources in the district has been initiated for which assessment is done and rationalization will be done accordingly.

- d. Releasing pending incentives of Service Provider (like ASHAs) and beneficiaries are quickened and also advised for regularly updating payments so that motivation level of frontline workers are boosted-up.

Nutrition

The following activities have been conducted by the ICDS to achieve the given targets and bring improvement in the indicators. They are;

- **Pre-school education** - Limitation of beneficiaries under Pre-school education, THR distribution under the Anganwadi Centers (AWCs) has been done away with. Hence, any beneficiary of this age in the area will be enrolled for the service.
- **SAG** - Survey is done for non-school going girls between 11-14 year age under the Scheme for Adolescent Girls (SAG) total no. of 7789 girls for providing THR, Skill development and other probable benefits.
- **THR** - Allotment for different components in pre-school education and THR is increased from Rs. 6 to Rs 8 for normal children, from Rs. 7 to Rs 9.5 of services for pregnant and lactating mothers, and from Rs 9 to Rs 12 for SAM children. This shall help AWCs providing food with more nutrition to the beneficiaries.
- **PMMVY** - 4,236 beneficiaries already enrolled for benefiting under Pradhanmantria Matritwa Bandana Yojana (improve nourishment among pregnant women and lactating mothers). Apart from this, 2,260 applications have been received.
- **AWCs** – Total sanction Aanganwari centre is 3433 out of which 740 AWCs are running in Govt. buildings and rest are running in Pvt. buildings. 39 AWCs buildings are under constructions.
- **RRS Portal** - 27,893 persons are enrolled (incl. 15,314 children, 6,034 pregnant women and 6,545 lactating mothers) in RRS portal.
- **ADHAAR** - 54 of 79 Lady Supervisors are trained on ADHAAR enrollment of children between 0 to 5 years of age.

Beyond this, ICTRTM (Information Communication Technology for Real Time Monitoring through mobile tab) is planned to be launched soon to track the progress of AWW online.

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT PURNIA

- 01-** Poshan Vatica at 100 Schools in Seven blocks is being run with the Collaboration of UNICEF and MDM Directorate to ensure the Supply of Vegetables for Students and address their health and hygiene.
- 02.** Out of 246 panchayats in the District Middle Schools in 177 Panchayats have been upgraded to high Schools to facilitate the secondary level education to students in remote areas.
- 03.** 1100 out of school children in the age group of 11 to 14 years were identified in the District. 21 Residential special training centers are being opened to facilitate their mainstreaming.
- 04.** For 3582 out of school students in 8 to 10 age group 298 non-residential Special training has been started in 298 schools to ensure their mainstreaming in formal School education system.
- 05.** Student-Class room ratio is optimum i.e-43.74 at elementary level.
- 06.** The process for recruitment for guest teachers has been started in high schools, to ensure subject wise teaching in remote areas.
- 07.** 9065 untrained teachers of Govt. and private schools have been covered through D.El. Ed programme under NIOS and their training is going on in 46 study centers in the District.
- 08.** School Uniform and scholarship fund for financial Year 2017-18 has been transferred in account of 130812 students in middle schools to help their educational activities.
- 09.** Weekly meeting of Block Education Officers is being held at the District level under the chairmanship of District Education Officer to facilitate the ongoing programmes of the Department and ensure their speedy progress.

Basic Infrastructure

- All habitations having population more than 500 have been taken under PMGSY Scheme.
- All habitations above 500 have been connected.
- Habitations having population more than 250-500 have been taken under State Scheme MMGSY.
- Habitations having population 100-250 are being taken under State Scheme GTSNY.
- Habitations having population below 100 are being taken by State Panchayati Raj Department.

1.Kushal Yuva Programme(KYP)-

- **100 % STATE FUNDED TRAINING PROGRAMME**

Kushal Yuva Programme (KYP) is the part of one of the “7 commitment ” namely “Aarthik Hal,Yuvaon ko Bal “and is a flagship scheme of the Government of Bihar under its good governance initiative.

It is 240 hours certificate course for

1. Communication Skill (80 hrs)
2. IT Literacy Skill (120 hrs)
3. Soft Skill (40 hrs),

Which target the youth of 15-25 age group

- **Centers for KYP Training-**

There are two types of center available in Purnia district for KYP Training

1. Block Skill Development Centre(BSDC)-

- Physical infrastructure is completed by the Government and handed over to the Private Entities for Technical Infrastructure set up for training.

2. Skill Development Centre (SDC) -

- SDC is a private training partner in KYP which has to develop its own physical infrastructure and IT Infrastructure
