

**District Level Training Program on Computer Awareness and NADRS Project,
15th March 2012, District Sehore (M.P.)**

The National Animal Diseases Reporting System (NADRS) is a centrally sponsored scheme being implemented by Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying & Fisheries (DADF) through National Informatics Centre. For successful implementation NADRS project, one-day training on basic computer awareness and NADRS project was held at Janpad Panchayat Meeting Hall, Sehore on 15 March 2012.

District Sehore has six NADRS nodes. 30 District level Animal Husbandry Officials, Block animal husbandry officers, Asst. Veterinary Officers and staff of district Veterinary department from all six nodes attended and interacted in the training program. Sh. Sanjay Joshi DIO, NIC Sehore welcomed the participants. Deputy Director, Veterinary Sehore introduced the participants. DIO NIC Sehore apprised the participants on the existing scenario of NADRS implementation in district. He described about objective of the training program and briefed about the project and its usefulness for the stakeholders.
