C. BRIEF NOTES ON THE DISTRICT- KATNI

1. Brief about the district-

Katni a pastoral district of Madhya Pradesh state with 79.60% people residing in bucolic. It is (also known as Murwara (Katni or Mudwara). It is a town on the banks of the Katni River in Madhya Pradesh, India. It is situated in the north-eastern part of the state. District area is 4,949 km square and 29th largest district in the state by population. Katni district has 8 tehsils, 407 Panchayats, 968 Villages and 6 Blocks. Dheemerkheda block is the farthest and is the tribal belt of the district. The most arduous block is Bahoriband with the difficult topography. The block does not have the basic amenities such as water, lack of the agricultural land makes it even the worst. The mineral and ores are sufficient in this belt. It is a home to vast reserves of limestone and bauxite. Besides these minerals, it deposits calcite, dolomite, and fireclay. District has a perfect balance between agriculture productivity and industrial development.

Katni was the significant tehsil of Jabalpur and it was declared a district in 1998. The agglomeration of the 3 cultures is observed in Katni namely Mahakoshal, Bundelkhand and Baghelkhand. Foundation stone of district was laid on 28th May 1998.

Katni is also known as city of marbles. It is the administrative headquarters of Katni District. It is in the Mahakoshal Region of Central India. The city is 90 km (56 miles) from the Divisional Headquarters of the region, Jabalpur. Katni is the second busiest railway junction of Madhya Pradesh and largest railway junction in central India. The District extends from 23' 37' N to 20' 80' N and from 79' 57' E to 80' 58' S and occupies an area of 4949.59 km².

Brief about the peculiarities in demography

Katni has a vast amount of Sindhi population who has migrated from West Pakistan after partition and came here as refugees and settled here now. They are very well assimilated into the local culture and environment. And, they are involved in various business and trade activities. Katni, being a centre of trade and commerce, has traditionally a large population of people belonging to trader class baniya belonging to Vaishnav and Jain sect of Hinduism. Katni district has some sects of tribal also in block Dheemarkheda.

There are some central institutions and Ordnance factory near the city which bring people from across India. The city's population marks an increase due to economic expansion, industrialization and modernization.

Brief about the terrain-

Geography:

Katni is located in central India at an 392 m. elevation from sea level. The District extends from 23' 37' N to 20' 80' N and from 79' 57' E to 80' 58' S. There are three major rivers in Katni - Katni River, Choti Mahanadi and Umdar. The shape of this District is roughly oval. Katni is a big Railway Junction of West Central Railway. The nearest airport is at Jabalpur, 110 km away from Katni.

Climate and Forest:

There are three main seasons – summer, monsoon and winter. Climate of Katni is average. The forest here occurs on the slope of hills and overall is rugged in district. Total forest cover is 1697.64 hectares. The district has affluent variety of Flora and serves as excellent habitat for animals and birds. The forest covers Satpura hills and serves as the extension of it.

Agriculture:

Main crops of Katni are paddy, wheat, gram, and pulses. There is good market of cereals and other agro-based products in Katni. Krishi Upaj Mandi katni has been given the status of A Class Mandi in India. 66642 hectare wheat cultivation, 69608 hectare of paddy, 27822 hectare for gram, 1804 hectare of jowar and 343 hectare of soya bean. The district is known for its sweet corn production and the Dheemerkheda block is altitudinous for this cash crop.

Minerals and Economy:

Katni is known as city of lime. Many types of minerals are found under the land of Katni; dolomite, bauxite, latrite clay, fire clay soapstone quartz, etc. are found in the form of minerals. Katni is now emerging as an industrial district. Ordnance Factory, ACC Cement Katni and Kymore, Averest Asbestos Kymore, SAIL India Kuteshwar Mines Barhi, Birla White Cement, etc. are already present and functioning well. Some industrial projects are on progress. As minerals are found in large part of Katni, mineral based industries are growing rapidly. Due to trade, Commerce and Industry, Katni is now emerging as an important place at the map of India.

Main crops of Katni are paddy, wheat, gram, and pulses. There is good market of cereals and other agro-based products in Katni. Krishi Upaj Mandi Katni has been given the status of A Class mandi in India.

Brief about any specific socio-economic-cultural peculiarities relevant from election management point of view

Katni is a commercial centre; and connected in all directions with major cities of India. Mainly pulses, floor stone, marble, etc. are exported from Katni. There are more than 50 pulse mills. Cloth market of Katni is an important trade hub for the surrounding regions.

Important Information:

People cultivate betel leaves in Bilahari and Dheemerkheda block which is unique as this confine to only two districts in MP and one of this is Katni. The district has abundance of sweet corn in season which is even transported to other cities, countries. Katni is the only district in the state Madhya Pradesh which owns an Organic Agricultural Training Institution which promotes teaching and training in organic fertilizers and crop. Every Tuesday it holds a session for its beneficiary.

Brief about the infrastructure availability

Katni city is a big Railway Junction from where the trains are departed to five directions. More than two hundred passengers and goods train pass through the Katni junction. Apart from the railway Katni is well connected by road. N.H.-7 (the longest highway of India) passes through the district.

Katni is surrounded by five neighbouring districts. These districts are connected by N.H.-7 and state highways. At least all the revenue villages are connected by road and villages and hamlets are well connected by rural area roads and approach roads.

All the Polling Stations are located in pucca buildings. In remote areas Polling Stations are linked with approach road.

As far as transport system is concerned, the extent of the district is well connected through railways, bus and private transport system.

The largest area of Katni district is covered with mobile network connectivity. There are some shadow areas in Dheemerkheda block in AC-91 for which wireless system will be arranged.

Brief about the places, which are generally inaccessible or difficult to reach

Though some Polling Stations of Dheemarkheda block are in remote area, these Polling Stations have the approach road. Polling Parties are sent there easily. Hence, no difficulty in reaching the Polling Stations.

Brief about the resource availability – manpower, logistics, IT related, etc-

There is no crunch as far as manpower is concerned. The required number of Polling Staff, Sector Officers, Zonal Officers, Counting Staff and Micro-Observers etc. will be managed through appointing the employees from State Govt., Central Govt. and Banking and Insurance sector.

At the polling time sufficient vehicles will be arranged for the polling parties, sector officers and police personnel. The material management will be done well in advance.

Smsing, webcasting in some polling stations, wireless system for shadow areas will be made available. The set up of a control room with separate phone no. will be done just after the notification of election. VVT and VST will be constituted and will be deployed at different places.

Brief about the weather & periods of inaccessibility & places of inaccessibility-

There are three main seasons – summer, monsoon and winter. Climate of Katni is warm and temperate. The forest here is situated on the slope of hills and overall is rugged in the district. Total forest cover is 1697.64 hectares. The district has affluent variety of flora and serves as excellent habitat of animals and birds. The forest covers Satpura hills and serves as the extension of it. Parliamentary election is expected in the month of April-May. As far as the climate is concerned in this month, it is summer season in this area. There is no large scale disaster or any other natural calamities recorded in this month. April-May is summer and not a rainy season. So there is no problem in reaching the polling stations in this month. Anyway, the arrangements of different type of vehicles will be made to manage any untoward situation.

Brief about the general law and order situation constituency wise-

District Katni usually has a normal law and order situation. As far as election is concerned, by going through the past records of police and magistrates, possibility of any serious law and order situations are very minimal but there is a need to be vigilant. Katni District has 13 Police

Stations out of which three Police Stations are in urban area and the rest police stations are in rural area. Katni is generally peaceful.

Naxalism- There is no trace of Naxalism in the district.

Communalism- No communal violence is reported in the district. A peaceful atmosphere prevails in the district. Anyway, a vigilant eye has been kept over the activities of any communal turbulence in the district. Day to day monitoring is done in order to maintain the law and order situation.

Dacoity- Katni district is not a dacoit affected area. No active gang is reported under operation.

ECI has launched multi-intervention programme SVEEP that reaches out through different modes and media to citizens and voters about the electoral process in order to increase the awareness and participation of voters.

All SVEEP activities and efforts are aimed at:

- (a) Increasing electoral participation through voter's registration and turnout.
- (b) Increasing qualitative participation in terms of ethical and informal voting.
- (c) Continuous electoral and democracy education.

- In order to know the reasons of the low turnout in these PS, a questionnaire will be made and circulated to the related BLOs to make a survey of the low turnout areas. The related BLOs will contact those voters who did not cast their votes in the last Assembly Election. Having a discussion with those voters, BLOs will find out the reasons why they did not cast their votes. Whether the reasons were communalism, migration for employment, due to dominance of persons, issues regarding development etc. or something else. After the identification, the BLOs will inform District Project Coordinator, Katni. After being informed a team comprising the officers and employees will be constituted in order to make those voters aware of their political rights.
- A campaign will be launched in urban area where the voter's turnout is low with the help of school teachers. Under the guidance of teachers, students will motivate their guardians to cast their vote. An oath-taking slip will be provided to students and their guardians. In those slips they will pledge for the promotion of participation in poll. The same drive will be launched in rural area in order to promote the voters for their active participation in polls and strengthening the democratic values.
- District Education Officer, Katni, District Co-ordinator Zila Shiksha Kendras, and District Co-ordinator Tribal Welfare will launch a campaign for the motivation of voters

to participate in the General Parliamentary Election 2019. For this they will make the programmes of workshop, debate, drawing and essay competition. They will organise rallies to motivate the voters. They will train the students to motivate their guardians to act for a powerful democracy and participation for all.

- Special camps will be organised through the door to door summary revision for the addition in the voter list for the students of colleges and higher secondary schools of the district who have attained 18 years of age.
- Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Katni, Chief Municipality Officer Vijayraghavarh/Kymore /Barhi will organise rallies in order to motivate the voters. Apart from this they will publicise this campaign through hoardings, posters and pamphlets tagged on railway stations, bus stands, and other community places.
- District Public Relation Officer Katni will publicise this campaign through local cable network and news papers.
- Gram Swasthya Raksha Samiti, Anganwadi Karyakarta, and ASHA Karyakarta will act as motivators for this campaign among the women.
- In these identified areas meetings of Gram Sabha and chaupals were convened and a discussion will be organised on the topic – **“No voters be left behind”**. Under the guidance of CEO, District Panchayat, Katni, CEOs of Janpad Panchayat will be prepared a schedule to convene the meetings of Gram Sabha and the related BLOs were directed to be present there with the voter list.
- Campus Ambassadors have been appointed in the Govt.and Private colleges and hostels as well.
- NGOs will be involved in their respective fields in order to promote the activities of SVEEP.

B. Gender Gap Analysis:

This gender gap analysis shows that the following polling stations have a gender gap of more than 10%. This gap has to be addressed. A campaign was launched to motivate the women of these polling stations. Anganwadi karyakarta, ASHA Karyakarta were directed to go Home to Home at these polling stations, in order to motivate the women voters' to participate in the electoral process and cast their votes. The details of polling stations having more than 10% gender gap in the last general parliamentary election are as follows:

Voters' Facilitation

Photo Voter Slip:

- Voter slip bearing the photo of the elector (wherever present in the roll) will be distributed at least five days before the date of poll.
- Accessible photo voter slips with Braille feature will be given to persons with visual impairment or blind.

Voters' Guide:

- In this election, a voter guide will be handed over to every household ahead of election, giving information about the date and time of polls, contact details of the BLOs, important websites and helpline numbers etc. This guide contains the information of the voters' polling station with the part and the information regarding Do's and Don'ts. This Voter Guide will be distributed along with the photo voter slip by the BLOs.

Voters Assistance Booths:

- Voter Assistance Booth will set up for every polling station location, having a team of BLO/Officials with the objective of facilitating the voter to locate his/her polling booth member and serial number of that voter in the electoral roll.

Note: The district Katni has prepared SVEEP Calendar for 2019. SVEEP activities will be conducted according to SVEEP calendar and as per the guidelines of CEO, M.P.

12. Risk Management Plan

Risk Management

Risks are integral part to any process, and so is the case with election. Depending on the Planning, preparation and resources, risks and hazards can be addressed in reactive, proactive and predictive ways. In order to manage the risks, strategy should involve the anticipation of risks, identification and interpretation of risks. The steps taken for risk management are as follows.

- Capability of electoral machinery has been updated.
- Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) has been developed for each and every identified and anticipated risk.
- A comprehensive DEMP has been prepared.
- In each aspect of electoral management, the risks have been identified and listed. To cope with the problems regarding risks and hazards, a work plan has been prepared.

Measures have been taken to address the risks, which are as follows:-

- Planning and preparation for the implementation of electoral activities has been completed.
- A lucid operational planning has been prepared to cope with the risks.
- Electoral officials have been trained properly.
- Training of security sector agencies has been organized.
- A voter information campaign (SVEEP) has been launched in order to make the voters aware of the democratic right to cast their vote without fear and greed.
- Vulnerable and critical polling stations have been identified. Measures will be taken to conduct free and fair poll at these stations.
- To keep the situation under control, different types of teams such as FS, SST, VST & MCMC etc. have been constituted. All the members are properly trained and they have been kept on alert.
- A proper security deployment plan for the district has been prepared to have a control over any adverse situation.

13. Technology Use Plan

The District Election Officer Katni has decided to have his election staff in touch with mobile network. In order to monitor the functioning of Electioneering SMSing, text messages through App and email will be used.

As far as the polling staff is concerned, their data of their mobile number will be prepared. A special kind of App has been developed at the state level at CEO office which provides a platform for the polling staff to contact with their Sector Officer and RO/AROs. This App has been tested in recent Assembly Election 2018 successfully. It will be utilized in the forthcoming General Election 2019 also to provide a better communication management.

Counting Plan

The Campus of Krishi Upaj Mandi, Katni has been decided to be the counting centre for all the four Assembly Constituencies of the district. The area of campus is 55 acres but only 05 acres of the campus will be used for the counting purpose. The campus of Krishi Upaj Mandi Katni is well-surrounded by a boundary wall.

This Campus has four shaded Halls. Every Constituency will be allotted one Hall. Though these halls are shaded, the sides are opened. For the security and safety purposes all these halls will be protected and separated with the help of tents and barricades. The proper arrangement will be made and the safety protocols will be followed to protect the halls from natural calamities like rain, fire & storm, etc.

This campus has four well shaded and covered go-downs which will be used to keep the EVMs after polling and a safe and secure passage will be provided to take the EVMs to the counting place. These go-downs will be treated as strong rooms for EVMs. A security and force deployment plan will be made with consultation of police administration.

Apart from Counting Halls and strong room for EVMs, different kinds of arrangement will be made as follows:

- (1) A well-equipped Chamber of DEO will be made to keep the overseeing view on the activities related with counting procedures.

- (2) To conduct the activities regarding counting procedure an Election Office will be established in a separate room.
- (3) A felicitation centre will be established in order to assist the officials and public in general.
- (4) Tabulation Room along with NIC computer room will be established for tabulation and other important works.
- (5) A Control Room will also be established to control and co-ordinate all the activities regarding counting.

Appointment of Counting Personnel

21 counting tables and one table for returning officer will be established in every vote counting room. Adequate barricades, lighting, sound system will be arranged for vote counting rooms and surrounding area. Counting of votes is scheduled to take place at respective counting centres. There will be 21 tables for Legislative Assembly segment and each table will contain two persons (1 counting supervisor & 1 assistant) in addition to the Static Observers. Counting will be taken place in the presence of Observers. Officers from the Central & State government will be deployed for the purpose. This may be subjected to change as per the decision of the Observers. Infrastructure and logistics arrangements (refreshment, stationary, Counting Hall arrangements and communication facilities) will be made in due course. Arrangements will be made for issuing passes for accredited media persons. Sufficient security will be arranged for counting stations. Arrangements are made for online updating of data from the counting centers to the Election Commission website. Polled voting machines will be stored in the strong rooms constructed in Krishi Upaz mandi Samiti, for this purpose. The strong room will house only the polled EVMs and the election papers connected with the current election.

Security Arrangements

A three-tier cordoning system will be set up in counting centre to prevent the entry of unauthorized persons inside the counting centre. No counting agent without proper identity card having the photograph, duly displayed on its person, will be allowed to cross the first cordon of the counting centre. The identity of all candidates, their election agents and of all the counting staff will also be thoroughly verified with reference to their identity cards at the first cordon.

The first cordon will be set up at the main entrance to the office building. A metal detector will be installed at this location. Force will be deployed till the entire counting process is completed.

Barricading of counting tables

A barricading about five feet high made of strong yet transparent material, such as wire mesh will be put up around the counting table and the counting personnel. One entrance will be made for taking in and bringing out the voting machines. The door of the entrance is proposed to be lockable only from the inside by the counting supervisors.

Room for the Observer inside the Counting Center

A separate room with tables and chairs, a telephone with STD and a fax, Computer Set with operator will be provided inside the counting center for the use of the Observers. The communication facilities will be reserved for the exclusive use of the Observers for their communication with the Commission.

Data Management

The Data Management Cell will be located adjacent to the Returning Officer's table. Five Computers, Printer, UPS, Telephone attached with a Fax Machine, Internet with High Speed Data card and sufficient stationary will be provided. The following Officers and staff will maintain the Data Management Cell-

Seating arrangements for counting agents

Counting agents will be seated in the following order-

- 1) Candidates of National Recognized Political Parties
- 2) Candidates of Recognized State Parties
- 3) Candidates of Recognized State Parties of other state who have been permitted to use their reserved symbols in the Constituency.
- 4) Candidates of unrecognized- registered Political Parties.
- 5) Independent Candidates.

Counting agents will be seated outside the barricades which enclose the counting personnel and the counting tables, in such a way that they have a clear view of the counting process but are not in a position to reach out and handle the control unit.

Number of counting agents

Each candidate will be allowed to appoint as many counting agents there are counting tables and one more to watch the count at the Returning Officer's Table.

Sequence of counting

Firstly, all persons who are allowed to enter in the counting hall will be given adequate warning about maintaining secrecy of votes as provided under Section 128 of the representation of the

people act 1951. The postal ballots received in time will be counted first at the RO's table and the particulars will be entered in the working sheets Constituency wise and Candidate wise. Male and female voters will be indicated as these particulars will be required for entry in the Index Card later. While the postal ballot paper of constituency are being counted, the control unit of the electronic voting machine of the constituency will be distributed to the 14 counting tables in serial order of the polling station.

Media Centre

The media centre is proposed to be set up at the counting center. Telephones intercom and internet facilities will be provided at the media centre. The result of each round of counting will be announced by the officer in charge in media center.

The media management committee must also be formed.

Entry into counting hall & maintenance of discipline

No person other than those mentioned under Rule 53 (1) of the conduct of Elections Rules, 1961 will be allowed inside the counting hall. Only the following persons can be allowed inside the counting hall-

- (1) Counting supervisors and counting assistants,
- (2) Persons authorized by the Election Commission.
- (3) Public servants on duty in connection with the election; and
- (4) Candidates, their election agents and counting agents.

However, entry of persons other than officials engaged in the counting of votes will be regulated by the Returning Officer in such a manner as may be required for maintaining discipline in the counting hall. Smoking, carrying of cellular phones, cordless phones and wireless sets will not be allowed inside the counting hall.
