

ORDER

I Dr. Priyanka Soni, IAS, District Magistrate, Kaithal in pursuance of the directions of the Election Commission of India during Lok Sabha General Election 2019 regarding prevention of defacement of property would hereby like to draw the attention of the political Parties/associations/candidates/person towards Model Code of conduct which states.

1. No political party or candidate shall permit its or his/her followers to make use of any individual's land, building, compound, wall etc. without his/her permission for erecting flag staffs, suspending banners, pasting notice, writing slogans etc.
2. Whenever any defacement of property, whether public or private has been carried out without the written permission of the owner of the building, the concerned party/association/candidates/persons would be prosecuted and proceeded against under Law namely, section 425, 426, 427, 433, etc. of the Indian Penal Code and also under Section 3 A of "The Haryana Prevention of Defacement of Property Act 1989" & Municipal Laws. Also the expenditure on the removal of defacement of the property would be recovered by the District Administration from the Concerned Party/Association/ Candidate/ Person etc.
3. It is also clarified that expression "Public Building" shall include but not be restricted to public properties like signboards, Indication of roads direction on the highways, precautionary notice boards for the railway platform/bus terminus or any other notice or signboards display for convenience of general public. Prosecution shall be launched against those who indulge in defacing the above types of property for electioneering campaign.
4. The Sub Divisional Magistrates will be Enforcement Magistrate in their respective jurisdictions to oversee the implementation of these directions. Necessary logistic assistance will be provided to them by the concerned SHOs and BD&PO's/E.D's/E.O MC/Secy, MCs'. The Sub Divisional Magistrate will formulate flying squad (s) for the purpose. The incharge of each squad /committee will immediately report any violation in this regard to the SDMs.
5. The Superintendent of Police Kaithal will also constitute Flying Squads under respective SHO's to check the defacement of properties as envisaged by the Election Commission under Model Code of Conduct.
6. Any Violation of the above direction or non-compliance with the same or any laxity on the part of any authority in the strict implementation shall be viewed seriously and invite strict action as per law.

This order will remain in force till completion of Election process.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 144 OF THE CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE, 1973

Whereas it has been made to appear to me that there is likelihood of causing tension annoyance obstruction or injury to person, danger to human life and property disturbance of public peace and tranquility within the revenue limits of the District Kaithal on account of the forthcoming 17th Lok Sabha General Election 2019 which is to be held on 12th May 2019 and Counting of Votes on 23-05-2019 in Haryana.

Whereas, it has been further made to appear to me that possession of fire-arms and ammunition in the revenue limits of the District Kaithal. even by the license holders is likely to cause obstruction in the maintenance of peace and tranquility and it has become necessary to get the fire-arms and ammunition deposited in respective police stations or with fire arms dealers.

Whereas **I, Dr. Priyanka Soni, I.A.S, District Magistrate, Kaithal** am satisfied that direction under section 144 Cr.P.C. are necessary to avoid danger to human life and property and disturbance of public tranquility, riot and affray and also for the maintenance of peace and tranquility and further that the circumstances do not permit of the serving in due time of notice upon the persons concerned.

Now therefore, **I, Dr. Priyanka Soni, I.A.S, District Magistrate, Kaithal** in exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of section 144 Code of Criminal Procedure,1973, hereby directs all the license Holders under Arm Act.1959 of the District, Kaithal to deposit their fire-arms and ammunition with their respective police stations or with the nearest fire arms dealer upto **25-03-2019** against proper receipt to be issued by the S.H.O. concerned or fire arms dealer concerned. The S.H.O. and fire arms dealer concerned shall be duty bound to ensure safe custody of all the fire arms so deposited till completion of election. The license Holders can take their fire-arms back from S.H.O. or fire arms dealer concerned upon production of the receipt on any day after election process is over. However, this order shall not be applicable to the police and other public servants on the duty.

Superintendent of Police, Kaithal will be responsible for the enforcement of these orders.

This order shall be promulgated within the limits of Kaithal through publicity van Public Relation Department as also affixing of copies of this order at District, Sub Divisional and Tehsil Courts, Public places as well as Police station.

The violation of this order is punishable under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 144 OF THE CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE, 1973

Whereas, it has been made to appear to me that all political parties, candidates and their workers, supporters and sympathies shall use loudspeakers for the electioneering campaigns which causes impairs brain activities so as to reduce thinking, affect blood vessels, cause hypertension, cardiac disease, digestive disorder, ulcers and the bio chemical disorders as per the scientific study. This results in serious noise pollution and causes great disturbance to the peace, tranquility and health of the general public.

Whereas the use of loudspeaker cannot be stopped altogether during the election period as the loudspeakers are on the means of election propaganda and imparting information to public. But at the same time, indiscriminate and unfettered use of loudspeaker at odd hours and at odd places at very high volumes which have the effect of disturbing peace and tranquility and cause annoyance to the general public, the sick and student community in particular cannot be permitted. Therefore, the reasonable restriction on playing of loudspeakers is essential.

Now, therefore, in exercise of powers conferred upon me under Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, I, **Dr. Priyanka Soni, I.A.S, District Magistrate, Kaithal** hereby order that :


- (i) The use of loudspeakers, whether fitted on vehicles of any kind whatsoever, or in static position used for public meeting for electioneering purpose, during the entire election period starting from the date of announcement of election and ending with the date of declaration of results shall be permitted only between 6.00A.M. to 10.00 P.M. In other words a public address system or loudspeakers or any sound amplifier, whether fitted on vehicles of any kind whatsoever, or in static position, used for public meeting for electioneering purpose, shall not be used at night between 10.00 p.m. and 6.00 a.m.
- (ii) All loudspeakers whether used for general propaganda or for public meetings or procession, and whether used on moving vehicles or otherwise, shall be used during the unrestricted hours only as per above mentioned clauses (i) a & b and never beyond.
- (iii) All loudspeakers being used beyond the hours as prescribed above shall confiscated along with all the apparatus connected with the use of these loudspeakers.
- (iv) All political parties, candidates and any other persons using any loudspeakers on moving vehicles including but not restricted to trucks, tempos, cars, taxies, vans, three wheelers scooters, cycle rickshaws etc. shall intimate the registration identification number of those vehicles to the authorities granting permission to use the loudspeakers and such registration identification numbers of the vehicles shall be indicated on the permits granted by the authorities concerned.
- (v) Any vehicle on which a loudspeaker is used without the said written permit shall be confiscated forthwith along-with the loudspeakers and all using apparatus.
- (vi) All political parties, candidates and even other persons using on loudspeakers either on a moving vehicle or at a fix shall intimate:-
 - (a) To the returning Officer of 15-Guhia, 16-Kalayat, 17-Kaithal, 18-Pundri Parliamentary Constituency and also to the Assistant Returning Officers of respective assembly segments.
 - (b) Local Police authorities, in writing the full details of the permits obtained by them before using any to those loudspeakers. In the case of mobile loudspeakers, the registration identification numbers of the vehicles shall also be registered by them with the Returning Officer and the Police authorities.
- (vii) No loudspeakers fitted on vehicles of any kind or in any other manner whatsoever shall be permitted to be used during the period of 48 hours ending with the hours fixed for the conclusion of the poll in any polling area of Kaithal district and even after the close of poll proper law and order is required to be maintained till completion of election after the declaration of result.
- (viii) Any violation of the above direction or non compliance by the political parties, candidates and their workers, supporters and sympathizers shall be viewed seriously and action be taken under section 188 IPC and other provisions of law. Any laxity on the part of any authority in the strict implementation thereof shall invite severe action against them for dereliction of duties.
- (ix) This order shall not apply to police and other Public Servants on duty. It shall be promulgated within the limits of Kaithal District by announcement through the publicity vans of Public Relation Department by fixing of the copies of this order on the Notice Board in Sub Division/Tehsil Courts and Public Places as well as the Police Stations.

In view of the emergent situation, this order is passed ex-grate and is addressed to the public at large.

The Order shall remain in force from 15-03-2019 to 27-05-2019.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 144 OF THE CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE, 1973

Whereas it has been made to appear to me that there is likelihood of causing tension, annoyance, obstruction or injury to personal danger to human life & property, disturbance of public peace & tranquillity within the limits of district Kaithal on account of ensuring due to the forthcoming 17th Lok Sabha General Election 2019 which is to be held on 12th May 2019 and Counting of Votes on 23-05-2019.

And whereas it has been made to appear to me that the carrying of any weapons of offence like licensed Arms/Fire Arms, swords (except sheathed Kirpan used as genuine religious symbol by Sikhs), Burchhas, Bhallas, Lathis and other weapon of an offence or any other thing which is capable of being used as a weapon of an offence in any public place and to take effective steps to unearth the un-licensed weapon within the entire area of district Kaithal is likely to cause obstruction in the maintenance of public order and tranquillity resulting in riot or affray.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of section 144 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, **I, Dr. Priyanka Soni, I.A.S.,** District Magistrate, Kaithal do hereby prohibit the assembly of five or more persons at public place without permission from DEO/RO/ARO and as a measure of emergency the carrying of any weapons of offence like licensed Arms/fire arms, swords (except sheathed Kirpan used as genuine religious symbol by Sikhs), Burchhas, Bhallas, Lathis and other weapons of an offence by the public within the entire area of Kaithal district with immediate effect to till further orders completion of election process.

This order shall not apply to police and other Public Servants on duty. In view of emergent situation & shortage of time, this order is passed ex-parte and is being addressed to the public in general.

This order shall be promulgated in the area of District Kaithal by beat of drum, by announcement through the publicity van of Public Relation Department and publication in Newspapers by affixing of the copies of this order on notice boards of Sub Divisional and Tehsil Courts, Public places as well as Police stations. All Concerned SHO's shall implement this order strictly.

The violation of this order is punishable under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 144 OF THE CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE, 1973

Whereas, it has appeared to me that there is likelihood of tension and apprehension of breach of provisions of section 127A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 regarding printing and publication of election pamphlets, posters etc. which causes disturbance public peace and tranquility during the 17th Lok Sabha General Election 2019 process in Kaithal district.

Whereas, the provision of 127A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 provides that no person shall print or publish, or cause to be printed or published, any election pamphlets or posters which does not bear on its face the names and addresses of the printer, press and the publisher thereof.

Whereas, the printing of pamphlet and posters etc cannot be stopped altogether during the election period as these are one of the means of election propoganda and imparting information to public. But at the same time, indiscriminate printing of pamphlets & posters causing annoyance to the general public & breach of conduct of election. Therefore, the reasonable on the printing of pamphlets, posters etc are essential.

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me under Section 144 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, **I, Dr. Priyanka Soni, I.A.S,** District Magistrate, Kaithal do hereby order that :-

- 1- No person shall print or cause to be printed any election pamphlets of poster:-
 - (a) Unless a declaration as to be the identity of the publisher thereof, signed by him and attested by two persons to whom he is personally known, is delivered by him to the printer in duplicate, and
 - (b) Unless, within a reasonable time after the printing of the document, one copy of the declaration is sent by the printer, together with one copy of document;
 - (i) Where it is printed in the capital of the State to the Chief Electoral Officer; and
 - (ii) In any other case, to the District Magistrate of district on which it is printed.
- 2- No person shall or use of plastic for preparation of posters, banners etc.
- 3- Any process for multiplying-copies of a document, other than copying it by hand, shall deemed to be printing and expression "printer" shall be construed accordingly;
- 4- "Election Pamphlet or poster" means any printed pamphlet, hand bill or other document distributed for the purpose of promoting or prejudicing the election of a candidate or group of candidates or any placard or poster merely announcing the date, time, place and other particulars of an election meeting or routine instruction to the election agents or workers.
- 5- Any violation of the above direction or non compliance by the owner of printing press publisher shall be viewed seriously and action be taken under section 188 IPC and other provision of law. Any laxity on the part of any authority in the strict implementation thereof shall invite shall action against for dereliction of duties.
- 6- This order shall not apply to Govt. printing press. It shall promulgated through the District by announcement through the publicity vans of the Public Relation Department by affixing of the copies of this order on the Notice Boards in Sub Division/Tehsil Courts and Public Places as well as the Police Station.
- 7- In view of the emergent situation, this order is being passed ex-parte and is being addressed to the public at large.
