

SELF SUFFICIENCY SCHEME

1. About your section:

Rural Development and Panchayat Raj Department / District Rural Development Agency, Karur.

2. Details about the schemes and activity:

Self Sufficiency Scheme is being implemented by the Government from 2011-12 onwards to encourage and improve the self reliant attitude of public and to enhance participation in creation and maintenance of community infrastructure. This kind of Participatory approach involving Contribution by public, supplemented with Government funds, helps the community attain “Self Sufficiency “in terms of the actual requirements.

Self Sufficiency Scheme is implemented both in rural and urban areas.

Eligibility Condition (who can avail the benefit / service):

- One third of the estimated amount will be contributed by public and remaining Two third of the estimate amount will be taken up in the concern scheme.
- Construction of buildings, laboratories, toilets, cycle stands and compound walls / fencing to Government Schools, Colleges and Hostels.
- Construction of buildings,Compound walls and fencing to Government Hospitals, Primary Health Centres, Sub centres, Veterinary Dispensaries, Livestock Centres and libraries.
Libraries in Rural and Urban areas, Noon Meal Centres, Anganwadis, School Kitchen Sheds and Public Distribution Shops in rural and urban areas etc., can be taken up.
- Providing water supply can be taken up.
- Purchase of Furniture, Computers and accessories for Government Schools and Panchayat Union Schools, Libraries and buildings under usage of the public.

- All types of works related to solid and liquid waste management and works related to improving the sanitation conditions of the environment.

Procedure to obtain the benefit Service:

- The need for taking up of works under “Self Sufficiency Scheme” may originate from individuals, groups, institutions, public or private companies or from the community.
- Request in the form of an application indicating the works to be taken up with consent and for contributing one-third of the amount by the public has to be given to the District Collector.
- The District Collector shall ascertain the actual need and feasibility of the work to be taken up with reference to the norms of the scheme. After justifying the need, the District Collector will call for the detailed estimates from the implementing agency. Then, the applicant has to deposit the prescribed amount by means of Demand Draft to the District Collector or Project Director, District Rural Development Agency so that sanction can be given.
- ½ the amount to be given. The work under this contribution is not tendered and shall be done by the contribution under the guarantee and measurement taken by RD department Engineers.
