Subject:- ICU facility with Ventilatory Support for COVID-19 Patient in at Civil Hospital Rewari.

This is with reference to the letter No. Estb.-I-2020/770 dated 06-04-2020 written by Civil Surgeon, Rewari addressed to you and annexed herewith for reference.

Civil Surgeon, Rewari has intimated that General Hospital, Rewari does not have any ventilator neither are his doctors trained to operate ventilator even if one would have been provided to them by the Government or by any Private Hospital from Rewari itself. It is kindly requested that in light of this observation by Civil Surgeon, is any training being planned for doctors working in Government setup to enable them to operate ventilator and consequent to such training, will they be trained enough to operate these ventilators efficiently so as to ensure that no life gets lost simply because of inadequate training. Kindly revert at the earliest and instruct the Civil Surgeon to arrange shifting of ventilators from private hospitals in Rewari to the ICU wards in General Hospital, Rewari in consultation with local Indian Medical Association. If you do not decide so, then you are requested to get all private hospitals in Rewari having ventilators notified as COVID-19 Hospitals as only 10 beds of Pushpanjali Hospital been notified for COVID-19 vide Government order No. 3PM (COVID) 2020/ 3453-3459 dated 04-04-2020. In case, you are of the opinion that government doctors cannot be trained at this juncture, it is kindly requested that same facility in any other district which is equipped with man & machinery be allotted for serious COVID-19 patients of Rewari.
